On September 1, 1999, you were notified of proposed modified flood elevation determinations affecting the Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) and Flood Insurance Study (FIS) report for the Unincorporated Areas of Richland County, South Carolina. The 90-day appeal period that was initiated on September 14, 1999, when the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) published a notice of proposed Base (1% annual chance) Flood Elevations (BFEs) for your community in The State, has elapsed.

FEMA did receive several appeals of the preliminary FIRM and FIS for the Congaree River during the 90-day appeal period. The appeals were submitted by Blanchard Investments, Columbia Venture LLC, a private citizen appellant, and the South Carolina Department of Natural Resources. With a letter dated September 26, 2000, the issues raised in these appeals were addressed and considered to be resolved. However, FEMA did allow a period for comments on the revised preliminary FIRM and FIS issued with the appeal resolution. Technical comments received from the appellants are addressed in the enclosure, titled "Final Flood Elevation Determination for the Congaree River in Richland and Lexington Counties, South Carolina," dated August 20, 2001. Proof copies of Richland County FIRM Panels 0091, 0092, 0094, 0160, 0178, and 0190 and Lexington County FIRM panels 0164, 0168, 0277, 0279, 0281, 0283, 0285, 0291, 0292, 0293, and 0294 along with revised portions of the FIS reports reflecting the final flood hazard information are also enclosed with this letter.

The determination (copy enclosed) of the Agency as to the BFEs for your community is considered final. The final BFEs will be published in the Federal Register as soon as possible. The modified BFEs and revised map panels, as referenced above, are effective as of February 20, 2002, and revise the FIRM which was in effect prior to that date. For insurance rating purposes, the community number and new suffix code for the panels being revised are indicated on the maps and must be used for all new policies and renewals. Final printed copies of the FIS and FIRM will be sent to your community prior to the February 20, 2002, effective date.

Effective with the date of this letter, we encourage your community to use the BFE and floodway data presented on the enclosed proof copies of the FIRM and FIS for regulating floodplain development in accordance with the guidance provided in the enclosed Floodplain Management Bulletin titled Use of Flood Insurance Study (FIS) Data As Available Data.

To assist your community in maintaining the FIRM, we have enclosed a Summary of Map Actions to document previous Letters of Map Change (LOMCs) (i.e., Letters of Map Amendment, Letters of Map Revision) that will be superseded when the revised FIRM panels referenced above become effective. Information on LOMCs is presented in four categories: (1) LOMCs that have been included on the revised FIRM panels; (2) LOMCs that have not been shown on the revised FIRM panels because of scale limitations or because the LOMC that was issued had determined that the lots or structures involved were outside the Special Flood Hazard Area shown on the FIRM; and (3) LOMCs that have not been included on the revised FIRM panels because they are being superseded by new detailed flood hazard data; and (4) LOMCs that will be re-determined. The LOMCs in Category 2 of this form are revalidated through a single letter that reaffirms the validity of a previously issued LOMC. LOMCs issued for multiple lots or structures where the determination for one or more of the lots or structures have changed (Category 4) cannot be revalidated through this administrative process. However, we will review the data which were previously submitted as part of the original LOMR or LOMA request and issue a new determination for the subject properties after the FIRM effective date.

The modifications are pursuant to Section 206 of the Flood Disaster Protection Act of 1973 (P.L. 93-234) and are in accordance with the National Flood Insurance Act of 1968, as amended, (Title XIII of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1968, P.L. 90-448), 42 U.S.C. 4001-4128, and 44 CFR Part 65. Because of the modifications to the FIRM and FIS report for your community made by this map revision, certain additional requirements must be met under Section 1361 of the National Insurance Flood Act of 1968, as amended, within 6 months from the date of this letter. Prior to February 20, 2002, your community is required, as a condition of continued eligibility in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP), to adopt or show evidence of adoption of floodplain management regulations that meet the standards of Section 60.3(d) of the NFIP regulations. These standards are the minimum requirements and do not supersede any State or local requirements of a more stringent nature.

It must be emphasized that all of the standards specified in Section 60.3(d) of the NFIP regulations must be enacted in a legally enforceable document. This includes the adoption of the effective FIRM and FIS report to which the regulations apply and the modifications made by this map revision. Some of the standards should already have been enacted by your community. Any additional requirements can be met by taking one of the following actions:

1. Amend existing regulations to incorporate any additional requirements of Section 60.3(d);
2. Adopt all of the standards of Section 60.3(d) into one new, comprehensive set of regulations; or,

3. Show evidence that regulations have previously been adopted that meet or exceed the minimum requirements of Section 60.3(d).


Communities that fail to enact the necessary floodplain management regulations will be suspended from participation in the NFIP and subject to the prohibitions contained in Section 202(a) of the Act as amended.

A Consultation Coordination Officer (CCO) has been designated to assist your community with any difficulties you may be encountering in enacting the floodplain management regulations.
