On behalf of Columbia Venture (CV), in response to the 30-day comment period that was provided with FEMA's proposed map for the Congaree River on September 26, 2000, I am attaching a document from [REDACTED] of CV dated October 26, 2000 which is CV's formal response to the 30-day comment period for the September 26, 2000 map (hard copy is being sent separately).

In addition to CV's formal response, I suggest that a viable resolution to the outstanding issues on the September 26, 2000 re-mapping of the Congaree River as proposed by FEMA (with subsequent modifications to its HEC-2 models) is to use the Lexington BFE model to determine the Lexington floodway. This resolution is suggested as being the most technically correct on the basis of our presentation in the October 18 meeting and the attached letter from Lockwood-Greene. Also, it is in accord and consistent with FEMA's allowance for a floodway surcharge of up to one foot above the corresponding BFE. In order to expedite the discussion of my suggested resolution, CV is willing to participate in a Facilitator-Assisted Resolution Meeting with FEMA.

During the course of FEMA's resolution process, please continue to fax me correspondence between FEMA and SCANA regarding the flood control benefits of Lake Murray. I would also appreciate you sending me a copy of any other comments that FEMA receives as a result of the public comment period for its Appeal Resolution Documents (including comments from agencies within the Department of Interior). If FEMA makes any additional revisions to its HEC-2 models, please e-mail the revised models to me and, copies to [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]).
